3. What happened when the Israelites cried out to God in anguish (Exodus 2:23-25; 3:9-10)?
4. What mistake did Moses make regarding God's assignment in his life (3:11, 13; 4:1, 10, 13)?
5. What does God promise us about the fulfillment of his promises (3:14-15; 6:2-5)? On what do God's promises depend?
6. How does God show the lengths to which he will go to deliver his people from bondage (chapters 7-15)?
7. If God did all this for the Israelites in their bondage, do you believe he can work in your situation?
8. How is the Exodus from Egypt fulfilled in Jesus' life, death, and resurrection?
9. How can you remember God's faithfulness daily?

Exodus 2:23-25 - [23] During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God. [24] And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. [25] God saw the people of Israel—and God knew.

Exodus 3:9-10 - [23] During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God. [24] And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. [25] God saw the people of Israel—and God knew.

Exodus 3:14-15 - [14] God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: "I AM has sent me to you." [15] God also said to Moses, "Say this to the people of Israel: "The LORD, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations.

Exodus 6:2-5 - [2] God spoke to Moses and said to him, "I am the LORD. [3] I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty, but by my name the LORD I did not make myself known to them. [4] I also established my covenant with them to give them the land of Canaan, the land in which they lived as sojourners. [5] Moreover, I have heard the groaning of the people of Israel whom the Egyptians hold as slaves, and I have remembered my covenant.
